





TEAMWORK!



When a summer resident of Monterey, an avid cyclist, suffered a heart attack while on the road with two friends, the Dispatcher fielding the 911 call alerted New Marlborough Fire/EMS and Southern Berkshire Ambulance. She then instructed the fellow cyclists how to perform CPR. Upon arrival, New Marlborough EMT's took over CPR and SBA Paramedic Art Subklew was able to restore circulation with the help of intravenous amiodarone, normally administered in a hospital emergency room.

After additional treatment at Fairview Hospital, the patient was airlifted to Mass General for cardiac surgery to clear arterial blockage. He was placed on a ventilator, recovered the ability to breath on his own, and returned home. He has recovered completely and returned to cycling.

Southern Berkshire Ambulance Paramedics are grateful for ALL who play a roll in bringing the emergency room to the patient – and ask that that you consider donating to help maintain this critical network of Emergency Medical Services in South Berkshire County.
